

A message from our Project Coordinator


Hello friends and sponsors,

Fozsef Balazsik

Joe is 62 and the newest member of our team at Livefree Project. Joe enjoys watching movies about space and spending time with his two grandchildren.

Joe has been a bus driver for the last 10 years, until he unfortunately had to stop due to a medical condition in his eyes. Since then, Joe had been looking for something new to try a few days a week and Livefree Project was recommended to him by another local charity.

Joe has been volunteering with us two days a week since November 2019, doing site maintenance, delieveries, participating in training, program set up and pack down, packing Oz Harvest and connecting with people at our breakfast program.

'I Just like being here and the people, they're just really kind and loveable. I love having an opportunity to connect with people. Being here makes me feel wanted'.





Kim is 31 years old and enjoys being creative, hanging out with friends,

This started Kim's almost 2 year journey to try and obtain an NDIS plan, throughout which Livefree Project supported and advocated for her.

" I didn't like myself before all of this, halfway through last year I had a turnaround where I started to value myself. I feel like a completely different person, it's almost like I can't even recognise who I was before it"

Since February 2019, Kim has had a self-managed NDIS plan, with Livefree Project as her plan co-ordinator and main provider. This has helped her to gain independence, plan and time manage, learn the skills required to live out of home, self care and improve her social interactions, probelm solving and communication skills.

Now, after a year of receiving this support through her NDIS plan, Kim has come leaps and bounds. In the last year, Kim has completed a marketing apprenticeship, a Certificate IV in Marketing and Communications, secured casual employment and volunteers for a notfor-profit as well!

Kim is the first person we have supported through the NDIS and as a team, it's been a privilege to do this journey with her and witness her growth first hand.

Volunteer - LIVEfree Project greatly appreciates all of its volunteers and has a variety of programs and services you can be a part of:


- Mentor programs, breakfast club and generational play run within local primary schools (2hrs a week)


